

- Decades in IT and related roles in the South Australian Public Service including programmer, project manager and systems manager, from 1973 onwards.
- Senior Adviser, SA Ministry of Technology, 1980-84. Advising on social and economic implications of technological change. Chairman of SA Branch of Australian Computer Society.
- Manager, Internal Audit, SA Education Department, 1984-85.
- Systems Manager, SA Economic Development Authority, 1985-89.
- SA WorkCover, 1989-95. Various roles including Records Management Administrator, Information Strategy Manager, Strategic Services Manager, Levy Support Manager.
- Implementation Consultant, EDS Project, SA Dept. of Admin. & Info. Services, 1995-96. Largest IT outsourcing project in southern hemisphere (over \$600m).
- Senior Policy Adviser on Emergency Services to SA Deputy Premier, 1996-97.

INVOLVEMENT IN BIBLE KNOWLEDGE

Jenny and I were missionaries with the Church Missionary Society of Australia (CMS-A) — see www.cms.org.au/2017/07/spotlight-workers-leaving-location. We worked in Tanzania from 2008 to 2017 for the Diocese of Kagera, Anglican Church of Tanzania. During 2015-2017 I established and coordinated a Bible Knowledge (BK) program for the diocese (www.bibleknowledgetz.com/bk-program). When I handed over to a Tanzanian coordinator in August 2017 we had 27 participating schools with nearly 4,000 participating students (including in the neighbouring dioceses of Lweru and Biharamulo).

Since leaving Tanzania and retiring, I have continued to support the BK program, primarily by writing additional teaching materials, establishing and maintaining a website, fundraising and advising.

REFERENCE FOR ANDY BENNETT AND THE BIBLE KNOWLEDGE TEACHING PROGRAM

I would like to confirm that Andy Bennett was a missionary with CMS Australia during 2008-2017 and during that time served with the Diocese of Kagera, Anglican Church of Tanzania.

A major part of his work there was to establish the Bible Knowledge teaching program for the diocese, which encourages and supports secondary schools in teaching this subject – one of the optional subjects in all Tanzanian secondary schools.

Andy coordinated this program until his departure in August 2017, prior to retiring as planned. I have discussed this program with various bishops in Tanzania, and it is held in high regard. I also understand that the program continues to be well coordinated by a Tanzanian pastor who reports to diocesan management, with whom CMS Australia has had a productive relationship for many years.
