## Bible Knowledge in 2020

July 2021

The year COVID struck the world was difficult for everyone. Tanzanian schools were closed from March to June. When they opened again, teachers and students had to work hard to make up for lost time in preparing for exams in late 2020. We thought that many students would drop Bible Knowledge – an optional subject – to focus on core subjects. But by the grace of God we completed 2020 with more students than the year before! Here are the stats for our program.

No national exams held in Forms 1 and 3.
