Teaching the Bible to Tanzanian students

Bible Knowledge (BK) in 2022

July 2023

In 2016, the program started with 17 schools in the Diocese of Kagera, Anglican Church of Tanzania. In 2017, the neighbouring Diocese of Lweru set up a similar program. Later that year, the Diocese of Kagera was divided, and part of it became the Diocese of Biharamulo which continued its BK program. In late 2022 the Diocese of Western Tanganyika also started a similar program, but it's too early to report progress. Each diocese is fully responsible for its own BK program, with its own BK coordinator and individual funding. While we have separate diocesan BK programs, it is one cooperative venture with centralised fundraising and the same books. Here are the statistics for 2022.

* The number of schools progressively increased. The figures shown are at the end of 2022.

It's amazing to see that the number of participating schools increased by 150% to 115 in 2022. This rapid growth is largely due to the hard work of the BK coordinators in the three dioceses, facilitated by a large increase in funding. We are thankful that the **number of students taking BK exams in our** schools also increased both at Form 2 level (2.5 times) and in Form 4 (3.2 times), and the pass rate also improved. This is great proof of the serious efforts of BK teachers and their students.

It is difficult to estimate the number of students who studied the Bible as part of our program in 2022 because various schools commenced teaching BK at various times, but it's likely that **about 5,000** students participated and many more will take part in 2023.
